I said, 'Plow new ground for yourselves, plant righteousness, and reap the blessings that your devotion to me will produce. It is time for you to turn to me, your LORD, and I will come and pour out blessings upon you.' Hosea 10:12

If I asked you: *"What is the most important area of the church?"* what would be your response? My guess is that most people would reply: *"The sanctuary."*

My response would be "*The Chapel/Prayer Room*" because it symbolizes the work of prayer that must form the foundation all that we do: worship, teaching, missions, music, evangelism. It is when God's people pray collectively, intentionally, and persistently that good fruit is produced in the other areas of the church. It is when God's people pray that the Spirit sweeps through the Body making us more like our Lord. It is when God's people pray that we are transformed into a new creation.

This month we are focusing on the centrality of prayer in our life together. Iris Uzzell, our Prayer Coordinator, offers two workshops, *Praying with Prayer Beads*, on Feb. 1st and Feb. 24th. Our worship services, Feb. 16-23, will present opportunities for us to pray in new ways. And, we continue to gather as a staff on Thursdays at 1:30 p.m. for prayer in my office. (As always, we invite you to join us at any time!)

The Daily Bread devotion on Jan. 16 highlighted the importance of prayer. David McCasland observed that "during evangelist Billy Graham's historic 1949 Los Angeles campaign, the big tent that held over 6,000 people was filled to overflowing every night for 8 weeks. Close by was a smaller tent set aside for counseling and prayer. Cliff Barrows, longtime music director and close friend and associate of Graham, has often said that the real work of the gospel took place in "the little tent," where people gathered on their knees to pray before and during every evangelistic service."

Let me encourage you to make *The Chapel/Prayer Room* the little room that provides the power for our great ministry. Let us all go there often to pray. In doing this, we follow the lead of our children. Connie Hickerson takes the *More Jesus Time* kids there to pray. As you enter the room, you are invited to write down prayer requests on the cards provided at the back table and place them on the prayer rail. In this way, we may pray not only for our needs and those of the people in our lives but also those in the greater community. As I was praying at the rail this week, it was neat to see that some people wrote how God answered their prayers!

As you pray this month, I ask you to lift up those who will be participating in the *Navigating Change Conference on Feb. 20-21*, in the *Radical Hospitality Workshop on March 8*, and in the *How to Reach Younger Adults Process on March 14-15*. Out of these experiences, our ministry plan for the rest of 2014 and beyond will emerge. Pray that we might discern where God is leading us! Pastor Daryl


Daddy's Hands



Nurses Notes for FEBRUARY 2014

Brrrr...what a bitterly cold winter we are having this year. I hope that all of you are keeping warm, perhaps in front of a roaring fire, snuggling with a loved one, or bundled up in a warm blanket with a good book! One thing I know about winter is that it helps me to appreciate and long for spring.

February is usually dedicated to Valentine's Day- a time to show how we love and care for others. But you may not know that February is designated as American Heart month. February is an appropriate month to raise awareness about heart disease and lifestyle changes - to help you have a healthy heart. National Wear Red Day is February 7th. This is a day designated to raise awareness of heart disease in women. Ladies- Go Red!

The area of heart health that I have selected to discuss is blood pressure. I am asked many guestions about blood pressure during office hours, cholesterol screenings, and home visits. Hopefully some questions will be answered more completely in this newsletter.

High blood pressure, or "hypertension," is the single most important risk factor for heart disease. When blood pressure stays in the healthy range, you reduce the strain on your heart, arteries and kidneys which keeps you healthy longer. High blood pressure means the blood running thru your arteries flows with too much force- which stresses them and can also cause tiny or microscopic tears. Although the body is able to heal the tears, it does so with scar tissue. This scar tissue can sometimes trap plague and white blood cells as they flow through our circulation, which can cause blood clots, and may also harden and weaken the arteries. Hypertension can lead to stroke, heart attack, kidney failure or heart failure.

Keeping your blood pressure in a healthy range will reduce your risk of damage or blockages, and protect your entire body; as the body needs a regular supply of oxygen that comes through circulation.

What is a "normal" blood pressure? Normal blood pressure is defined as a systolic (top number) under 120 and a diastolic (bottom number) under 80. The top number measures the pressure in the arteries when the heart beats (contracts). The bottom number measures the pressure in the arteries between heart beats (filling and resting). More attention is given to the top number as a risk factor for heart disease for people over 50. The systolic steadily rises with age due to stiffness of the arteries, and the long term build up of plaque.

The risk factors for heart disease can include the following: family history, advanced age, being overweight, smoking, certain medications (such as diuretics, cardiac, or Parkinson's medications), endocrine conditions, nutritional deficiencies, and problems with heart valves. Some of the risk factors you cannot change- but some you can.

So what is a person to do to decrease risk factors? Start with the following:

1. Eat a heart healthy diet.



3. Maintain a healthy weight.

4. Manage your stress and stop smoking.

5. Monitor & keep track of your blood pressure. (One BP reading at the physician's office is not a good indicator of high blood pressure.) When is a good time to start on this new heart health campaign? How about at this month's Heart-Stroke Fair at Alton Memorial Hospital! The heart-stroke fair is Saturday, February 15th from 9 a.m. to noon. There will be free screenings, including blood pressure & cholesterol (which includes cholesterol, HDL, LDL and triglycerides). You must register for the cholesterol screening, and it is fasting. A free boxed lunch will be provided by Subway. There will be two guest speakers: At 10 a.m. the speaker will be Dr. Rama Gondi, a cardiologist on staff at AMH. At 11:30, the speaker will be Kelly McCreary, a paramedic on staff AMH. Kelly will speak on her role as a paramedic, and someone who has suffered two strokes in the past 15 months. There will be a variety of information booths to provide details on heart attack, congestive heart failure, emergency care, angioplasty, smoking, diabetes, sleep disorders, nutrition, and much more. The AMH Heart & Vascular Center and AMH Stroke Center will have featured tables too. There will also be breast screenings for women, aimed at women who do not have insurance, who have breast health concerns, or have not had a breast exam in over a year. You must register for an appointment. You must register in advance for any of the screenings and to get the free boxed lunch! Please call 1-800-392-0936. The Heart-Stroke Fair is an excellent way to start off the New Year for those seeking to assess their heart health. and learn about prevention and treatment of heart disease. Please consider your heart health this month and join us at the fair.

Please remember that I have office hours each week, for any questions or concerns about health - whether physical or spiritual. Monday office hours at Roxana Church of the Nazarene are 9 a.m. - 11a.m., St. Paul UM Church are Tuesday 9 a.m. - 11 a.m., and United Methodist Village on Thursday from 10 a.m. - 12 noon. I provide blood pressure screenings and will record them for you each week. You can take the recorded BP's to your physician for review. Many times I have been told the physician likes to see them. This gives the physician more than just the "office BP" to review to see how your medications are working, if the medication needs to be increased or decreased, or to help them in their decision to place you on blood pressure medication. It is another way to take responsibility for your health.

Aging well is a choice for most people. It means making smart choices for your body, mind and spirit. The good news is it is never too late to start! Keith H. Elliott, 85, passed away at 7:55 a.m. Wednesday, Jan. 1 at Bethalto Care Center. Born on June 18, 1928, in Alton, he was the son of Herbert and Mayme (Klopmeyer) Elliott.

He married the former Dorothy Donelson on March 7, 1951, in Alton. She survives. Also surviving are a son, Chris (Lori) Elliott of Valier, IL; two daughters, Debra Teachman of Chapmanville, WV and Vicki Stewart of Rosewood Heights; five grandchildren, Nick (Shannon) Stewart, Brandon (Jess) Stewart, Amanda Thesier, David Elliott and Mark (Melissa) Elliott; six great-grandchildren, Rylan and Elizabeth Stewart, Michael Thesier, Parker Stewart, and Gunnar and Huck Elliott.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one sister, Audrey Adcock. A U.S. Army veteran, he served during the Korean Conflict. Keith retired from Clark Refinery Engineering Department. He was a longtime member of St. Paul United Methodist Church in East Alton. He loved his church family and all his special friends. He will be sadly missed by all who knew him. He devoted his life to doing for others. He loved his family and enjoyed the grandchildren so much. He was a wonderful husband, father & grandfather.

During the celebration of Keith Elliott's life, this is a portion of what I shared: "The editor of the Bible version I read chose this heading for I Corinthians 13: **THE WAY OF LOVE.** As I prepare for a celebration of someone's life, I spend considerable time searching Scripture for that particular passage that captures for me the essence of their life. Keith Elliott saved me from this search because this passage from I Corinthians 13 not only was his favorite Scripture but captures so well the essence of his life.

What Paul says here isn't very radical. During the Last Supper, Jesus tells the disciples that **they are to love each other as He has loved them.** They are to love each other with the same sacrificial, whole-hearted love that Jesus has poured into each of their lives. In fact, **the world will know they are Jesus' disciples by their love.**

What is radical is trying to live **this way of love**. It's easy to love humanity in the abstract. Sometimes, it's pretty hard to love the neighbor who lives next door.

In life, Keith was humble. He did not regard his contribution as more important than the person beside him in the pew. It was enough that he was blessed to use his gifts to build up the Body of Christ. It was for this reason God gave him engineering skills. All that counted for Keith was that Christ be honored by his gifts used in service of his church, his family, his community.

I want you to reflect a moment upon this verse: Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. This verse captures the spirit of a man who beat back cancer three times, who loved his children unconditionally, who was an encourager in the lives of his grandchildren, who was a devoted friend to so many here, and who made Christ-like love the foundation of his marriage to Dot.

I am convinced that only a man who believed this verse with every fiber of his being could live the life that Keith Elliott lived. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

It is our Risen Lord who gives us hope today. I Corinthians 13:8 proclaims that **Love never ends.** Some of the gifts we bring to the Body of Christ disappear or fade with time, but that is not true of love. Love endures.


As difficult as today is, we take comfort in this truth. The love that Keith shared with us and we returned does not diminish in its purity, its intensity, or in its strength because of his death. It goes on and on and on. The grandchildren may share Keith's Christ-like love with their children.

Paul tells us in the Love Chapter that **three things remain: faith, hope, and love. But the greatest of these is love.** A life well lived is a life lived spent walking the Way of Love. Isn't this ultimately what Keith has taught us? The Way of Love is the better way for all of us."

As I look over to the pew where Keith & Dot sat, I will miss Keith's presence. More than this, I will miss the love he shared freely with all of us. Please keep his family in your prayers. Pastor Daryl
