

Greetings people of infinite worth!

My first six weeks as your pastor has been a warm and welcoming experience, and I thank you all for your kindness and generosity! The trustees have been so helpful and hardworking getting the parsonage ready for Joe and me. The children have created beautiful, hand-made cards to welcome me as the new pastor. Our secretary extraordinaire has been a wealth of knowledge and guidance! I have enjoyed hanging-out and drinking coffee with the Women of Worship as they create amazing crafts to sell this fall. My husband Joe and I have breakfasted with the men's group at Polly's. Our Parish Visitor has been so kind as to take me to visit some of our dear, faithful, homebound folks. Our youth group, Kind, has been fun to spend time with; last night we went to a movie together. The fact that I am, well...um shall we say, vertically challenged, created a minor obstacle with pulpit height. However, that little problem was met with grace and speed as I now have a riser to stand upon while I preach! The sound crew has been so very helpful to work with me so that I can be heard despite my soft spoken ways. Certainly, St. Paul has exemplified the love of Christ toward me and my husband!

One of my roles as your pastor is to cast a vision for the future of the church. As I come into your midst with 'new comer's eyes' I have something on my heart. I am not alone in thinking about this because some of our members have commented on it. The issue that deeply concerns me is the low numbers of children and youth engaged in Sunday School, youth group, and in the life of the church. We have heard it said that, children are the future of the church. While that is true, children are also the

'present' of the church; they are the 'now' of the church. If we don't serve them now, connect them with Christ, and allow them to serve and participate in the life of the church, how will they lead the church in the future?

This is a concern that must be met head-on by the entire church. I ask that you would be in prayer with me as we walk this path together. Let's proceed in faith to prepare our church for our future. While we are praying and discerning together about how we will reach more children/youth for Christ, here are some actions we can take right now to serve the children God desires to send our way.

Nursery workers – We must have a loving, and well-staffed nursery for the young families. We presently have one youth who is willing and available to serve in the nursery, but we need at least two more adults. We need to have two nursery workers at a time with our littlest members. With three (or more) people agreeing to serve in this way, we can make a schedule in which no-one is scheduled to work every Sunday.

Safe Sanctuaries – This is a training program sanctioned by the United Methodist Church. Anyone in the church who works with children/youth should have this training. Children are our greatest treasure; let's learn ways to protect them from harm.

Calming the Chaos – From time to time, local training opportunities come to my attention; this is one of them I plan to attend and I am inviting anyone in the congregation to come with me. This training will help prepare us for working with children. Please see the flyer in the Steeple on Page 8 (and on the bulletin board) for further information.

I am so grateful for the children who presently attend worship, Sunday School, and youth group. They bring such joy to our church! And I want to thank the parents, and grandparents who bring them to participate in the life of the church! You are giving them an education that the world will not; a Christian education has eternal consequences.

Let's prepare for the way that God is going to answer our prayers! Blessings! Pastor Debra

Leaning on the Healing Power of the Holy Spirit

It's wonderful to know that you can lean on the Holy Spirit in the tough times.

It's wonderful to know that, as believers in Christ, we can live in close fellowship with God. Jesus said in John 16:7 (AMP), "I tell you the truth, it is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper (Comforter, Advocate, Intercessor, Counselor, Standby)

will not come to you; but if I go, I will send Him (the Holy Spirit) to you [to be in close fellowship with you]."

When Jesus walked the Earth, He could be in one place at a time and He could be *with* the disciples. But the Holy Spirit can be everywhere, all the time, and He lives IN those who have accepted Christ as their Savior. Being *with* Jesus is good, but having the Holy Spirit *in* us is even better. We don't have to go looking for God because He's as close can get!

See, when we receive Christ and we're born again, it literally means that God—through the power of the Holy Spirit—comes to live inside us. He makes us new on the inside, and as He works in us, the fruit of what He's doing is seen in the way we live and does some good for the people in the world around us (2 Cor. 5:17, 21; John 14:17, 26; Acts 1:8; Gal. 5:22-23).

Who He Is to You.

John 16:7 tells us who the Holy Spirit is: Helper, Comforter, Advocate, Intercessor, Counselor, Strengthener and Standby. John 14:26 (AMP) says "He will teach you all things." The Holy Spirit is THE Teacher and He guides us into all truth.

Think of this in the standpoint of recovering from things in the past that have hurt you. Many people come to God because their lives are messed up and they don't know what to do to fix it. They've tried everything they know to do, and nothing is working. So finally, in their desperation, they ask for His help.

Thankfully, God wants to help us and heal us—spirit, soul and body. He wants to bring restoration to us so we won't live in a state of recovery forever. He wants us to be whole in Christ so we can help someone else. We need the Holy Spirit to lead us to truth one step at a time, and we need His strength to confront things that are hard to face so we can get victory over them.

In my journey with Christ, He's brought so much healing and restoration to my soul—my mind, will, and emotions. My father sexually abused me throughout my childhood. When I left home at 18, I thought, "That's over! I'm putting that problem behind me." But I took the problem with me because the wounds of the abuse were still in my soul.

The pain of my past affected my thinking, how I operated emotionally, all of my relationships and even my will. I was rebellious and stubborn, and promised myself no one would ever hurt me again. And then I was born again. It's so important to understand that we cannot do this on our own, but as we lean on the Holy Spirit for the strength to face our problems, we can overcome them.

Run to Your Source of Healing, Not From Him.

If you have hurts from abuse, disappointments, an injustice or any other kind of mistreatment, you will have to face them with the help of the Holy Spirit to be healed of them. Anything you run from has a certain amount of power over you, and until you face it, every time it raises its ugly head, you have to run some more. Thank God you don't have to do it alone!

As I began my journey to wholeness in Christ, I had to face some painful things I had been avoiding and, at times, running from. I had to take responsibility for my wrong attitudes, mindsets, and behavior and lean on God for the wisdom and strength to change.

Recovery and restoration of our souls takes time. One step at a time, the Holy Spirit guides us into truth that sets us free. The truth is, you can't heal yourself, but you can be completely healed and whole in Christ, because all things are possible with God!

Seeking an Organist

Please know that your desires for an organist are being heard and acted upon. The SPRC and I hear your desires for an organist and are doing all we can to find and hire such a person. Presently, I am in conversation with a woman who is very gifted in playing a pipe organ. Because of her rare skill, she is much in demand. I ask of you, do not let the temporary lack of an organist keep you away from your church family. I would also ask that you be not only patient, but prayerful that God provides us with just the person for the task.

The referral to the organist we are now considering came out of a casual conversation on a very different matter. As you go about your daily conversations with friends, family, and co-workers, perhaps you might discover a person who could fulfill this role at St. Paul.
