

#### **Dear Friends**,

Thursday, April 18th at 7 p.m., we will hold a Maundy Thursday (Holy Thursday) service at St. Paul UMC of Rosewood Heights. A Maundy Thursday service is a time of quiet reflection; the service is somber and thoughtful in tone. Please join us for this unique service!

Lent is a period in the church year that reminds us to slow down. It's a season in which we tune-in to our faith, and to pray about how God wants to change us. The hope is always that our time of introspection will lead us to repent and to open ourselves to become what God wants us to be. With-in the last week of Lent, other services are held depending on the tradition. In the tradition of the United Methodist church we celebrate two special services in the week before Easter. The better-known service of the two is Good Friday, in which we remember the crucifixion of Christ. The lesser known service is called Holy Thursday or some call it Maundy Thursday. This service commemorates the last meal Jesus had with his apostles. His apostles, who were still Jews, would have called it the Passover meal. Indeed, a traditional Passover meal is what they expected, but Jesus had another plan. Jesus was always doing things to surprise his followers: feeding multitudes of people with very little food, healing the sick, raising the dead, and



spending time with the poor and oppressed. Jesus introduced the seeds of many beloved Christian traditions at this Passover meal.

Jesus' plan for the Passover meal began a day or so before the meal when he told his disciples to rent the upper room in a particular building. He instructed them to purchase the ceremonial foods necessary for the traditional Jewish meal. (Luke 22:7-13 and Matthew 26:17-19) In the upper room, the words Jesus speaks to his listeners are some the same words we use in our traditional Holy Communion service; they are based on Luke 22:19-20 and Matthew 26:26 -28. During the Passover meal, Jesus tells his followers that one of them will betray him to the religious leaders. (Luke 22:21-22 and Matthew 26:20-23) Jesus demonstrated his servant's heart when he humbles himself to wash their feet in John 13:3-5. In the culture of the day, only the lowest servant of the household would wash the feet of guests, but Jesus took that task for himself. He was making a point about love and service.

Finally, Jesus ended the meal with a new commandment, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another." (John 13:34) The word Maundy comes from the Latin word, "mandatum," which means mandate or command. The Maundy Thursday service is named for the new mandate or command that Jesus gave his followers at the last meal he would share with them before his arrest, crucifixion, and resurrection. On Maundy Thursday we remember how Jesus met people where they were; he taught people from what they knew, he blessed his betrayer, he humbled himself as the servant of all, and he pointed the way to love.






April's Loose Change Project is the Community Hope Center








## **2019 EASTER CANTATA** 'In Christ Alone" CHRIST

# ☺ → <u>SALE GOES THROUGH</u> ← ☺

As of April 5, 2019 St. Paul UMC, via the Trustees, sold the property known as the Jr. Parsonage at 360 Airline Drive! As you may recall, based upon a majority vote of the church members held at a church conference on March 15, 2018, the decision was made to sell the Jr. Parsonage to reduce existing church debt. Therefore, as a result of that church-wide decision, the proceeds from the sale of said property which sold for \$92,700, after closing costs and miscellaneous costs were taken out of the proceeds, along with an additional \$5,592.67 from the Capital Fund Campaign treasury were all used to eliminate our debt of \$89,092 to 1st Mid America Credit Union for the "Mission Possible" Campaign.

As you know we have spent just under \$500,000 doing much needed renovation work to the church facilities. Through your prayers and generosity we incurred a debt of only \$160,020 of which \$89,020 was to 1st Mid America CU and the remaining \$71,000 to a loan from the St. Paul Endowment Fund. It is important to note that a large part of the remaining Capital Fund Campaign treasury will go toward eliminating part of this in-house debt. Trustees, in a future meeting, will consider keeping some of the funds in reserve as a jump start on future physical needs of the church.

With the elimination of the "outside" debt to 1st Mid America CU we pray that you will continue your generosity toward erasing our "in-house" debt to our Endowment Fund. This we do in an effort to respect the long-time philosophy of St. Paul UMC in having a debt-free church.

We are so thankful to the congregation for your vision and generosity. The trustees have gone over and above; they have labored long and hard to make difficult decisions to continue the viability of our physical church & ministry within the community. Pastors Daryl Fansler and Debra Hoertel have provided constant inspiration and spiritual guidance in leading our efforts to a successful fruition. Many thanks to the original "Mission Possible" team for their time and dedication to the vision and for providing wonderful facilities for the future of St. Paul.
