Greetings, People of Infinite Worth!

Time is ticking away for our mission trip...as of this writing, we are **24 days and counting** from departing for Honduras. Lists abound: packing lists, to do lists, and what to buy lists! We are taking fluoride treatment kits, plus thousands of toothbrushes and toothpaste. Our construction workers are bringing some tools and our cottage industry team members are bringing the tools of our trade: crochet hooks, knitting needles, patterns, fabric, and thread. For most of our team, this will be one of many mission trips to Honduras. This will my first trip to Honduras and Joe's second. It is our prayer to learn, to teach, and to touch the hearts of our Honduran brothers and sisters.

One of the churches we serve is called, El Paraiso (Paradise). When it was built, the congregation had a dream of building a two-story structure. However, as a new congregation, they could not afford to build such a large building. Since then, God has blessed the congregation abundantly and now building a second floor is not just a dream, but a necessity! Some of our crew will continue the work at El Paraiso to add another floor. Our team will be working with local construction workers to complete this project. Fortunately, we have several people on our team who are experienced in construction work. Digging out rocks and hauling concrete bags are not new to them. Construction work in June in Honduras is hot and sweaty work! Please be in prayer for their health and safety.

One of our goals is to empower the women of Honduras. The unemployment rate is high, and few men are able to provide the entire financial support for their family. The women are gifted and willing to work, but jobs for women are even more scarce than jobs for men. For various reasons many women are raising children without a partner and they too need the skills to begin a cottage industry. We hope to teach the women some skills that will enable them to work from home by producing items for sale. These cottage industries are often the mainstay for Honduran families. The profit from what the women produce means the difference between educating the children or sending them out to work. Among our team of missionaries, we have people who will teach the women how to knit and crochet items for home use, and for sale. We will hold a seminar on how to sew a tote bag (bolso grande) that could be sewn quickly from locally available fabrics and sold in the local market. Pray that our seminars are fruitful and that our students are empowered and blessed!

Another part of our project in Honduras will be to promote dental health for the children. These dear children have been raised in poverty and have never seen a dentist. Generous donors have given us enough fluoride treatment kits to protect the teeth of 2000 children! In addition to fluoride treatments, we will be giving the children their own toothbrush and toothpaste. Because of the generosity of St. Paul UMC Rosewood Heights and other churches, we will be able to give 2500 children their own toothbrush/paste. Dental health is closely linked to overall health and longevity; pray for these precious children that we may improve their lives with the care we give them.

Prayer and missionary work go hand in hand. Our Honduras team covets your prayers as we prepare to go and serve God's people in Honduras. We ask that you follow the prayer calendar (<u>see insert</u>) during the month of June. While it is true we will only be in Honduras for the last half of June,

don't forget that there are mission teams all over the world that need your support and prayers. Praying according to the "30 Ways to Pray for Missionaries Calendar" will bless not just our team, but all missionaries across the globe.


OUR CHURCH FAMILY & THANK YOUS!



Mission Possible

"THROUGH GOD ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE" MATTHEW 19:26

As announced earlier this year, the work of the Mission Possible (topping over \$500,000) is complete. The Jr. Parsonage has been sold and the proceeds, along with approximately \$5,500 from the CFC checking account, were used to pay off our debt to 1st Mid America Credit Union.

The Trustees along with the Church Finance Committee and Church Council have agreed to move \$5,000 from the total that remains in the CFC account into the Trustee Reserve Fund as a jump start on any physical needs of the church in the future. Approximately \$2,000 will be kept in the CFC checking account to pay for incidental church building physical needs in the next few months and the remaining money, approximately \$26,000, will be transferred to the St. Paul Endowment Fund to pay down our in-house loan of \$71,000. The new transfer plus the \$1,000 we already paid to the Endowment Fund leaves us with a balance of approximately \$43,000 of indebtedness to the fund. The very last of our remaining indebtedness!

We ask that you **continue in prayer** about our church's physical needs and **consider either continuing or beginning** a financial contribution to help us pay down our debt to ourselves in the "Endowment Fund." (To do this, pay any monies to the **Capital Fund Campaign designation** as you have done in the past.) Not only is it important to pay ourselves back, to adhere to this church's longtime philosophy of being debt-free, but it is equally important to put ourselves back into a position of paying our fair share of apportionments for the ministry work of the United Methodist Church in general.

Your generosity and prayerful approach to supporting the church's work is appreciated more than mere words can express! God bless...

30 Ways to Pray for Missionaries

These ideas can help you focus prayer on the needs your missionaries face every day. For more resources on prayer, visit EncompassWorldPartners.org/Pray.



Focus on God

Pray for missionaries to stay focused on God and His plans above all else.

But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be provided to you. -Matthew 6:33

2. Faithful Bible Study

Pray for missionaries to spend much time in the Word, and ask God to give them discernment.

Be diligent to present yourselves approved to God, a worker who doesn't need to be ashamed, correctly teaching the word of truth. -2 Timothy 2:15

3. Confession and Repentance

Pray for missionaries to regularly seek examination by God, and to repent from any errors that have crept into their lives.

Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my concerns. See if there is any offensive way in me; lead me in the everlasting way. -Psalm 139:23,24

4. Humility

Pray for missionaries to have a spirit of humility, and to willingly ask God for wisdom in carrying out their assignment.

Now if any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously and without criticizing, and it will be given to him.—James 1:5

5. Purity

Pray for missionaries to be so renewed by God's Word that no sin will have dominion over them.

Make my steps steady through Your promise; don't let sin dominate me. –Psalm 119:133

Boldness

Pray for boldness in the missionaries when they share the gospel or preach.

Pray also for me, that the message may be given to me when I open my mouth, to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel. –Ephesians 6:19

7. Rest

Ask God to help missionaries recognize their need for weekly rest away from ministry responsibilities. He said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a remote place and rest a while." -Mark 6:31

8. Guard the Treasure

Pray for missionaries to stay focused on the gospel

of Jesus Christ and not be distracted by issues of the day.

Hold on to the pattern of sound teaching that you have heard from me in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. Guard, through the Holy Spirit who lives in us, that good thing entrusted to you. –2 Timothy 1:13,14

9. Give Glory to God

Ask God to empower missionaries to point people to Jesus and not seek undue recognition for themselves.

In the same way, let your light shine before men, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.—Matthew 5:16

10. Dependence on God

Pray for missionaries to model a life of dependence on God.

Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not rely on your own understanding; think about Him in all your ways, and He will guide you on the right paths. -Proverbs 3:5,6

11. Gracious Speech

Ask God to give missionaries the grace to know how to respond to each person.

Your speech should always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you should answer each person.

-Colossians 4:6

12. Spirit of Unity

Pray for a spirit of unity as missionaries work together, and with other ministry partners.

Now may the God of endurance and encouragement grant you agreement with one another according to Christ Jesus.

-Romans 15:5

13. Resist Temptation

Pray for missionaries to be quick to take the escape God provides when temptation sneaks up on them.

God is faithful and He will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation He will also provide a way of escape, so that you are able to bear it. -1 Corinthians 10:13b

14. Retreat with God

Pray for missionaries to take personal prayer retreats to get their direction from Him.

The Lord God has given Me the tongue of those who are instructed to know how to sustain the weary with a word... He awakens My ear to listen like those being instructed. —Isaiah 50:4

15. Stand Firm

Pray for missionaries to stand firm under affliction and to look forward to eternal glory.

For our momentary light affliction is producing for us an absolutely incomparable eternal weight of glory.

-2 Corinthians 4:17

16. Daily Prayer

Ask God to help missionaries protect their time for prayer and personal mediation in God's Word. But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the preaching ministry. -Acts 6:4

17. Devotion to God

Pray for missionaries to maintain their devotion to Christ.

But I fear that, as the serpent deceived Eve by his cunning, your minds may be corrupted from a complete and pure devotion to Christ. -2 Corinthians 11:3

18. Hear God

Ask God to teach missionaries to hear His voice and follow Him.

The sheep follow him because they recognize his voice. -John 10:4

19. Boast in the Lord

Pray for missionaries to be quick to give God the credit.

So the one who boasts must boast in the Lord. -2 Corinthians 10:17

20. Direction from God

Pray for missionaries to get their direction from the Lord only.

I am the Lord your God, who teaches you for [your] benefit, who leads you in the way you should go. -Isaiah 48:17

21. Peace

Pray for missionaries to give all their anxious thoughts to God, and rest in His peace.

Don't worry about anything, but, in everything through prayer and petition with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses every thought, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. -Philippians 4:6,7

22. Prayer Support

Pray for missionaries to enlist personal prayer support and ask God to call faithful intercessors to respond.

So Peter was kept in prison, but prayer was being made earnestly to God for him by the church. -Acts 12:5

23. Strong Marriages

Pray for marriages of missionaries to be strong and healthy.

Husbands, in the same way, live with your wives with understanding of their weaker nature yet showing them honor as co-heirs of the grace of life, so that your prayers will not be hindered. -1 Peter 3:7

24. Eyes to See Like Jesus

Ask God to give missionaries eyes to see as He sees and empower them to love the unlovely, the rejected, and the outcasts, as Jesus did.

Man does not see what the Lord sees, for man sees what is visible, but the Lord sees the heart. -1 Sanuel 16:7b

25. Express Love

Pray for missionaries to model loving God completely and others as themselves.

Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.

-Mark 12:30

26. Hunger for God

Ask God to give missionaries a hunger and thirst for Him and for His word.

But solid food is for the mature — for those whose senses have been trained to distinguish between good and evil. —Hebrews 5:14

27. Persistence

Pray for endurance, stamina, and pacing for missionaries to insure long-term, fruitful ministry. I pursue as my goal the prize promised by God's heavenly call in Christ Jesus. —Philippians 3:14

28. Team Spirit

Ask God to build strong teams among missionaries working together so that He gets the glory.

So then neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth...for we are God's co-workers... -1 Corinthians 3:7-9

29. Obedience

Pray for missionaries to love and obey God, and to be known for their dependability to obey regardless of outside pressure.

If you love Me, you will keep My commandments.
-John 14:15

30. Sacrifice of Holy Living

Ask God to empower missionaries to be healthy in mind, body, and spirit.

... I urge you to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God; this is your spiritual act of worship. Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind... -Ronans 12:1,2
