Greetings People of Infinite Worth!

A few weeks ago, my husband, Joe, went on a unique hunting trip. It was special for him in several ways. First, he was able to spend time with this best friend, Frank. He and Frank grew up together in Belleville. They joined the Marines together and have been great friends since Kindergarten. The second unusual thing about this hunting trip was that Joe had never hunted birds before; it was a brand-new experience for him. He loved it!

The third and most important aspect of this trip was that it was reserved for veterans of all ages. This trip placed him shoulder to shoulder with some terrific men and women who had faithfully served their country. Many of his shooting companions served during the Vietnam era and they had injuries and illnesses as a result of their time in the service. Some of the vets suffered with PTSD, post-traumatic stress disorder. Several were still in physical pain due to injuries received while on duty. Others were struggling from illnesses caused by the chemicals used during that period. He heard stories of lonely people and broken lives. It deeply touched his heart.

EFLECTIONS... When I think of veterans, I tend to think them as a group; a faceless group of men and women who gave up a piece of their life for the security of our nation. But Joe's experience with the hunters reminded me that veterans have faces and their stories are as different as they are. My father, for example, was a veteran and he served in the Navy during WWII. He volunteered during the Korean War as well; his duty called him to be away from the family for three years. Dad was one of the lucky ones. He came home without physical injury. The GI Bill was available to him, and he used it for his education. He and my mom purchased a home in the suburbs and raised the five of us kids on meatloaf and mashed potatoes. The fact that he was the sole support of a wife and five children boggles my mind, especially in today's world of two-income families. My father was part of the Greatest Generation and I am proud of what he accomplished.

My husband, Joe, served in the Marine Corps. He too was one of the lucky ones; he completed his military hitch unharmed. His friend Frank, whom I mentioned above, was not so fortunate. Frank was injured in Afghanistan when his caravan ran over a land mine. His injuries are both physical and emotional. My brother David served in the Navy, and his son, Richard served as well. David ended his military career unscathed, but his son Richard has emotional scars that may never heal. The pain is real and our veterans are suffering.

Every November, we remember our veterans. This year on **Sunday, November 10th** when we gather to worship, let's remember those who served so bravely. As we sing our patriotic songs and place our hand over our heart, let's remember that some of our veterans have not only sacrificed their time of service, but also their physical and mental well-being. Many of them struggle still despite the fact that they have been out of the military for decades. I thank God for their willingness to serve.

Gracious Lord, heal and protect our veterans; bring healing to the physical and emotional wounds sustained during their time of service. Be with their families as they work together to cope with the struggles of life after military service. In your mercy, hear our prayers!




Sundays at St. Paul in NOVEMBER 8:15 & 10:30 A.M. Services




2019 Christmas Cantata

Mission Possible

"THROUGH GOD ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE" MATTHEW 19:26

Earlier this year it was announced that the work of the Mission Possible (topping over \$500,000) was complete. The Jr. Parsonage was sold and the proceeds, along with approximately \$5,500 from the CFC checking account, were used to pay off our debt to 1st Mid America Credit Union.

The Trustees along with the Church Finance Committee and Church Council agreed to move \$5,000 from the total that remains in the CFC account into the Trustee Reserve Fund as a jump start on any physical needs of the church in the future. Approximately \$28,000 has been transferred to the St. Paul Endowment Fund to pay down our in-house loan of \$71,000. This transfer plus the \$1,000 we already paid to the Endowment Fund leaves us with a balance of approximately \$41,000 of indebtedness to the fund. The very last of our remaining indebtedness!

We ask that you <u>continue in prayer</u> about our church's physical needs and <u>consider either continuing or beginning</u> a financial contribution to help us pay down our debt to ourselves in the "Endowment Fund." (To do this, pay any monies to the **Capital Fund Campaign designation** as you have done in the past.) Not only is it important to pay ourselves back, to adhere to this church's longtime philosophy of being debt-free, but it is equally important to put ourselves back into a position of paying our fair share of apportionments for the ministry work of the United Methodist Church in general.

Your generosity and prayerful approach to supporting the church's work is appreciated more than mere words can express! God bless...
