Greetings people of infinite worth!

I don't often use the Steeple as a platform to recommend a book, but I am doing so today. This book was recommended to me at a pastor's conference; I immediately purchased it; it was so absorbing that I was not able to put it down. The name of the book is, "**Crucial Conversations**," by a group of writers: Patterson, Grenny, MacMillan, and Switzler. The thesis of the book is that crucial conversations are not merely those that take place between presidents and prime ministers. Crucial conversations occur anytime **three factors** come together. The three factors are: opposing opinions, strong emotions, and high stakes. I think these three factors have come together in our beloved United Methodist Church. As we get closer to the General Conference in May, these factors will take center stage regarding the on-going controversy over same-sex marriage and gay clergy.

An odd and unfortunate truth about crucial conversations is that they generally happen in the moment. Most often, we can't prepare for them, we cannot predict when they will arise, and when they do come up, we often say things that are not helpful.

Sometimes, in retrospect we realize we have said some pretty dumb or unkind things. Crucial conversations can plunge us into what scientists call, **lizard brain**. Lizard brain thinking occurs when we are using only the most primitive part of our brain, the part that limits our thinking to one of three options: fight, flight, or freeze. None of these options are conducive to honest, and respectful conversations. I think we all really desire our conversations, especially our difficult conversations, to be honest and respectful. How do we talk to people with whom we disagree about emotional issues? As we get closer to the General Conference, these conversations will certainly arise; let's not let them blindsides us to the fact that God loves us all; we are his children.

I cannot possibly condense **Crucial Conversations** into one page, but some of the guiding principles are: think about what you want to happen as a result of the conversation, think about what you want for the other person, and think about what you want for the relationship. Most of us just want to be respected, heard, and understood even if we disagree with one another.

Crucial Conversations is not a Christian book, it is written for a business application; however, the principles are sound and Christ-like. The writers encourage honesty, gentleness, understanding, and respect. They offer strategies to attain the best results from our social interactions. People are complex beings and we all come to the table with our personal histories and our hang-ups. I cannot suggest strongly enough that we read this book, for the good of our congregation and every other aspect of our lives.

The tragic skiing accident of January 15, 1995, that claimed the life of Meghan Hickerson of Hartford, IL, will never be forgotten.

God has a way of healing hurt and turning tragedy into triumph. Meghan's death immediately gave life to several people, known collectively as "organ donor recipients." Her legacy of faith and service lives on through the "Meghan Hickerson Christian Teen Leader Memorial Scholarship" that is made available through St. Paul UMC.

Meghan was a student leader who set a standard of excellence within the public school system. She also set an example of faith and dedication by spreading God's love through her church and her academic life, to all she encountered. Our goal each year is to reward one or two

deserving college-bound graduating seniors who sets for him or herself the same standards of outstanding scholastic achievement and faith reflected in their everyday life.



Items for sale will be accepted beginning **WEDNESDAY, MARCH 11** and ending on **MONDAY, MARCH 23**.





A decision has been made on how the altar flowers will be handled throughout the rest of the year (at least on how we are going to try to handle them).

We have stopped any arrangement with Dick's Flowers for them to bring fresh flowers. The **WOW craft ladies** will instead create bouquets to go where the altar flowers have been going and will change them every month or so.


Be sure to take your fresh flowers home with you after the service.
