Dearest Family,

I greet you in the strong Name of Jesus Christ!

I am extremely excited to report that according to the most recent information given by Bishop Beard, we are able to hold services outdoors here at St. Paul again. The occupancy limit has been lifted for outdoor events/services, from a maximum of 10 people to as many as can safely meet. For everybody's safety, we will still have to maintain social distance requirements and we will have to wear masks. Since most of our outdoor attendees already sit in family groups, that should not be a problem.

Our present goal is to **begin outdoor services on Sunday, June 21st at 8:45 or 9:00 a.m.** Please note, my goals and God's plans often do not coincide with one another. The way information has been changing at the last moment has left us all a little unsettled. This date could change, but I want to offer that date to all my prayer warriors so that we can be praying that God makes a way for us to meet safely starting on that date.

I foresee us continuing into September with outdoor services, rather than stopping at Labor Day. When we do begin to hold services indoors again, we have many more issues to ponder. Worshiping indoors brings with it many more potential areas of risk because of the enclosed space, proximity to other people, and frequently touched surfaces. We will take this process one step at a time. By the grace of God, we will be meeting again in our beautiful sanctuary.

Why not start meeting right now? We have several concerns that we must address for everyone's safety and peace of mind before we can begin to meet again outdoors. We want to meet in such a way that our set-up crew feels safe and protected. We need to figure out how to offer communion safely. The small hymnals will not be used because of the potential for passing the virus. How will we collect the offering without passing a plate? What about bathroom usage? Do we have special close-by parking for those who don't want to get out of their cars? Can we safely have congregational prayers and singing if we are wearing masks? Do we offer some form of written bulletin with announcements? If rain threatens, we will have to cancel the service for that day. These issues and more are being discussed by our church leaders. As you can see, there are many things to think about before we begin meeting again. I am confident that we will find a way for us all to meet again in safety.

As you ponder some of the issues being discussed, you may have some thoughts that we are not considering. If you have questions or ideas you would like us to think about, please send an email to the church and we will welcome your thoughts as we go forward. Even with all the safety measures we are taking, some people will not feel comfortable meeting for worship. For those especially vulnerable people who just don't feel safe, please stay home. If going out is just too risky for your health situation, do not feel badly about remaining in quarantine. We are planning to continue our on-line services. We hope to begin to record our services live, but presently we don't have the ability to do that. Gracious Lord,








THE TOP TEN PREDICTIONS FOR 2020


