Years ago, I worked for a man who immigrated to the U.S. from Great Britain. The phone system there was different from how ours works. For us in the U.S., if I were a businessperson calling another business, I might feel free to enjoy some personal chat with that other businessperson. We might talk about family or the weather; it is good way to build relationships. Since I called them, the phone charges would be on my bill. The longer the call, the more I would be billed, but if I am paying the bill, that would be okay because I would be spending my own money. However, in Great Britain at the time, it was the recipient of the call who paid the bill. For example, if I called a business and I kept them on the phone unnecessarily, that would be rude of me to spend their money on non-business chat. As a result, my boss was in the habit of keeping phone conversations very short and to the point. To us, it seemed unfriendly or perhaps rude, but it was a habit he carried from his early days of doing business in Great Britain. Brief and to the point conversations were his way of being respectful of others' money.

Now we live in a world where the hugs and handshakes that used to be a sign of love and friendship are currently not safe. We avoid seeing the people we love most because we want to protect them from getting sick. We avoid large gatherings; we no longer meet for birthday parties or other celebrations, not because we don't want to celebrate, but because we love our family and friends so much, and we want to protect them. We are in an odd time when keeping our distance equals kindness and the separation we create demonstrates that we care and respect others.

We are beginning to **open the church for worship** and like so many other things; church will be different than it was. Here are some of the changes you can expect: our early, outdoor service will begin at **8:45 a.m.**, Awakening will begin at its usual time, **10:30 a.m.** We will encourage social distance seating. There will be no congregational singing, no praying aloud by congregation, and no hugs and handshakes. For the time being, we will not offer communion. The collection plate will be placed where people can drop in their tithes and offerings as they enter or leave the worship space; we will not be passing the plate. In-person children's ministry is on hold per Bishop Beard's request. You will notice that the **Hymnals** and **Bibles** are not under the pews, nor are **envelopes** and **pencils** stored in the backs of the pews. If you customarily use a pew Bible or an empty envelope, for now please, **remember** to **bring your own personal ones.** I have talked to our Adult Sunday School teachers; they will not be holding classes until later.

We will **only have <u>one bathroom</u>** available for use for now; it will be the one nearest the sanctuary in the entryway. We are requesting that it be used as little as possible, but if needed, please wipe down the handles, etc. with sanitizing products that will be in there and available for your use.

We are planning to hold the early service outdoors as weather permits through the month of September. If it rains, or if the ground is too wet, we will hold that service in the sanctuary. In that case, we will sanitize the sanctuary between services to help ensure the safety for our attendees. I had a meeting with our custodian and we talked about what he needs to do to clean and sanitize the church during the week.

We are making many changes in our worship practices and church facility to ensure the health and safety of our people. Despite our efforts to make in-person worship safe, some people will not feel comfortable gathering for in-person worship. If you decide to not gather, please know that we respect your decision; it is okay. Your presence will be missed by your church family. We will begin to record the

Awakening service and it will be downloaded and available from our Facebook pages and church website. The recorded Awakening service will become our online service going forth. We hope and pray that all our members stay connected the best way they can.





St. Paul Bell Monument

On Sunday, June 27, 1965, Harold & Marilyn Rich presented to St. Paul a church bell on behalf of his parents, Mr. & Mrs. Edgar Rich, in memory of his grandfather, Mr. Ellsworth Johnson, and in honor of his grandmother, Mrs. Annie Johnson. The St. Paul Pastor at the time, Rev. Jack L. Adams, received the bell on behalf of the congregation and performed the rite of dedication.

The bell formerly was used at Bethesda Methodist Church about five miles north of Golconda, in southern Illinois. The church is no longer open. Upon the church's closure, then Carbondale Methodist Church pastor Rev. Jack Adams, petitioned the Southern Illinois Conference (1962) to give the bell to the Rich family (whom he served as their pastor). The petition was granted.

The origin of the bell began in the mid 1890's when Mrs. Annie Johnson, who was at that time a young bride, rode over the Pope County countryside on horseback and/ or horse/buggy to secure donations for the purchase of a bell for the then young congregation at Bethesda. Upon completing the fundraising, the bell was cast in Cincinnati, Ohio, in 1896.

After the purchase by St. Paul of the current carillon (1994), the bell became obsolete and was finally retrieved

from the bell tower (where it sat rusting away) early this year by the trustees. Through generous donations of materials, labor, and/or money by: Wagner Equipment Inc., Tom Martin of Spencer Auto Body, as well as memorial funds for Marcella Gimmy and Ben Moore, and with the labor by the current trustees we have the finished product (see picture).
