Greetings People of Infinite Worth!

In late September of 2019, I remember agonizing about which 2020 planner to purchase. Have I mentioned that I love the New Year? I agonized between two types of planners: planner 'A' and 'B'. After I purchased planner 'B' an even better design surfaced, and it was cheaper than either 'A' or 'B'. I was upset with myself; I should have waited to purchase a planner until later in the year. As January 2020 unfolded, I kicked myself for not waiting to purchase planner 'C'. Now I laugh at how I obsessed about which planner to buy, because it did not matter in the long run. Most of my 2020 calendar pages are empty. How often do we obsess about things that turn out to be unimportant?

Very little has gone according to plan so far in 2020. Most events, meetings, services, and gatherings look astonishingly different than we had expected, if they occurred at all. If you have been in the United Methodist family for any length of time, you may be wondering, whatever happened to Annual Conference this year?

Annual Conference (AC), for those who are not sure what it is, is a yearly meeting for the clergy and the laity (non-clergy), the bishop, and his cabinet. Thousands of us meet in Peoria, IL at the convention center. The purpose of the AC is to worship together, and to discuss and vote on church business. Normally, it occurs during the first week in June. AC was postponed this year because of the Coronavirus. However, it has been rescheduled for during the month of August. Like so many other gatherings, it will look markedly different this year than in years past.

The date for **AC** is August 15th. We will not all meet together in Peoria, however; several locations are available for those who want to gather in smaller groups to view the proceedings via the Internet. One or two churches out of each district will be open and available for people to meet so they can discuss and vote on legislation. Those who do not feel comfortable meeting at churches for AC, have the option to 'attend' and vote from their home computer screen.

What are some of the things that happen at AC besides discussion and voting? When we meet in person, we enjoy reconnecting with our colleagues. We might have a special lunch with our graduating class or fellow alums. The worship is outstanding and the speakers are the very best! Naturally, this year, we will miss out on the fellowship aspect of AC. We always honor and celebrate the clergy brothers and sisters who are retiring. This year, like years before, we will watch the short videos the retirees made about the highlights from their tenure or tell us about what they intend to do in retirement. We will remember and honor the ministries of churches that have completed their mission and are closing. This year there are ten churches closing. We will celebrate the ordination of new pastors and welcome the new candidates for ministry. I have chosen to attend the AC via my computer at home. It will be a strange experience to be sure.

As always, I pray for my dear church family as we weather this difficult time. I pray that you are feeding your souls as best you are able. Just a reminder that on Sundays we have inperson worship at 8:45 a.m. and we meet outdoors as weather permits. If the ground is wet or it is raining, we meet indoors. Our Awakening service continues at 10:30 a.m., in the sanctuary as usual. We are recording the Awakening service and the link can be found on Facebook later in the morning, or you can access it through our church website under the "sermons" tab.



Sunday Services at St. Paul in **AUGUST**





Things I am learning as I go thru this "fire".....

1. Be honest with God about how you're feeling.

Relationships start with being real. So if you're feeling forsaken by God, tell Him that. Ask God your questions and prepare your heart to hear His answers.

2. Give God glory anyway.

Our feelings don't change the fact that God is worthy of being worshiped. In fact, it's often through worship that we discover the cure for our worry. When we focus on who God is, our perspective will eventually shift—even if our situation doesn't.

3. Remind God of His promises.

Throughout Psalm 22, David basically tells God, "I know who You are. And since You're always true to character, deliver me like You've delivered Your people before me." Reminding God of His promises is not only an act of faith, but it also helps **us** remember the faithfulness of God's character.

Ultimately, God's faithfulness was personified when Jesus was crucified. Jesus willingly suffered alone on the cross so that we could experience eternal companionship with God. Jesus is the prophetic fulfillment of Psalm 22. And, because He endured separation from God, we never have to.

Take a moment to reflect on Jesus' ultimate sacrifice for you.





ST. PAUL UMC PHONE TREE, "OTTO"

We introduce you to "Otto," the automatic phone call system (our Phone Tree). Some of you may recall that in the past, the church has used an automatic calling system to inform members of event reminders or church cancellations due to inclement weather. We are in the process of updating our Otto phone lists for the call system. We will only use Otto in case of last minute changes or reminders for worship services or church meetings or activities/events.



There is nothing you need to do, <u>unless</u>:

- 1. You want us to use a different phone number, (a cell phone **instead** of a land line or visa-versa)
- 2. You want us to use an additional phone number, (a cell phone & a land line or both spouses' numbers)
- 3. You do **not** receive a call from us on that day but want to be added to the list.
- 4. You would prefer not to receive any calls. (Not recommended)

If you desire a change, please contact the church and we will update our phone list to reflect your preference. This is a wonderful way for us to communicate with all of our church family.



Activating the Healing Power of God's Word

"Your words were found and I ate them. And Your word became to me the joy and rejoicing of my heart, for I am called by Your name, O Lord God of Hosts." (Jeremiah 15:16)

It is encouraging to find that many of the passages of Scripture that deal with healing point us to the healing power of God's Word. The reason it is so encouraging is that we have the Word of God in our

hands and so can plead with God to fulfill these promises in our lives by faith and the work of His Spirit. Solomon counsels us to cling to God's Word in our hearts. (**Prov. 3:1**)

The mercy and truth that God speaks forth to you from the Word are designed to work in you a life that will "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will direct your paths." (**Prov. 3:5-6**)

The truth embraced and lived is health. "It will be health to your body, and strength to your bones." (Prov. 3:8) The Message paraphrases it like this: "Your body will glow with health, your very bones will vibrate with life!" The ways of God marked out for you in His Word are said to be "ways of pleasantness, and ... peace. She is a tree of life to those who take hold of her, and happy is everyone who retains her." (Prov. 3:17-18, MEV)

Embracing God's truth activates all that is good, all that is honoring to God, and all that is concerned with true joy. Here is how you find the satisfaction, contentment and appreciation of God and His created gifts and joys. By doing so you implement what God calls you to and you know the fulfillment of God's promises. You will know the joys of serving your wife or husband, family and community. (Ps. 112) By embracing God's truth, you will know the love of God poured out into your heart. (Rom. 5:5) You will know how to deal with fear: "He shall not be afraid of evil tidings; his heart is fixed, trusting in the Lord." (Ps. 112:7)

It is life renewed to enjoy daily the majesty of God in appreciation of all His gifts to us and callings that rest upon us in a life with anointed purpose.

The healing that comes from the Word of God is described in Nehemiah. The captives who returned from Babylon gathered to hear the Word of God read and explained. The effect of that day was to teach them that "the joy of the Lord is your strength." (Neh. 8:10c)

The message of the healing power of God's Word is found throughout the Bible. *Psalm 107:20* says, "He sent His word and healed them and delivered them from their destruction." God sends His Word to us. We are often jarred off-center when illness comes our way; we easily get discouraged and flounder in a disoriented perspective of our lives.

Prayer is the opposite of self-reliance. Joy is the opposite of self-pity. A thankful spirit is the opposite of cynicism. These negative dispositions are the things that destroy you; joy, prayer and gratitude are the graces that enliven you and keep you living in the presence of God who is your only source of lasting and satisfying peace. When this realization dwells in you, you see the folly and vanity of life and understand that everything is contingent upon divine goodness and grace.

When your heart is infused with God's Word, you observe a wholeness and balance, and understand that the love and joy you experience today, and the appreciation you can offer in worship now, are elements in your eternal life with Him. This is healing.


