



we need lots of volunteers! Most of our activities will be outdoors, so we will need people to keep an eye on the children for their safety. There are tasks for every ability level. Not all tasks will be working with children. We have places for people who don't want to be outdoors, for those who are not steady on their feet, or for whom walking is difficult. We will need bathroom monitors and servers. We will need people to escort the children to the bathroom. Some tasks will just involve being another set of "eyes and ears" to keep the children safe. Truly, we have tasks for any ability level. Check out the same bulletin board showing what volunteers we still need!

Jamie recognizes that hosting VBS is lots of fun, but it can be "overwhelming and exhausting". Yet every year she is inspired by the children who express how glad they are that they know Jesus. The last VBS we hosted in 2019 we collected money for the Honduras Mission Team, and the children were so excited and happy to show the love of God to children in another country. It is amazing to see how open-hearted and giving our children are.

Let's remember the reason we host VBS; our goal is to inspire children to seek after Jesus. We are planting seeds of faith in some children whose families do not have a home church, and

we are encouraging and nurturing other children who already know Jesus. Keep in mind that Jesus has a special place in his heart for little ones and it is his greatest desire that they should come to him. What a great privilege it is for us to be the ones who point the little children to Jesus. Let's not pass-up this opportunity to point the children to Jesus.
