Leroy "Jerry" Lyons, 92, passed away May 14, 2023 after a long cancer battle. He was born March 18, 1931 in East St. Louis, the son of Roy Lyons & Lola (Shaum) Lyons-Katonah.

Leroy graduated from Alton High School in 1949 and served in the Military Air Force from 1949-1953. He was a proud member of the United Association of Journeymen and Apprentices of the Plumbing and Pipefitting Local #553 for 69 years.

Leroy, also known as, "Jerry," pitched baseball for Alton High School and was recruited to pitch for the Air Force. He excelled at corkball, was an avid bowler, and a St. Louis Cardi-






