

Therefore, I call you to take our faith into action this coming year and in the years ahead.

Pastors are servants and I am here to serve with my utmost capacity. But I am also just one person... and for our churches to flourish, your commitment, help, and dedication in Christ Jesus are needed to make our ministries successful and meaningful. Only through our team effort with Jesus as our team leader will we survive and thrive. I am excited, encouraged, and blessed by this call, praying that the power of God's Spirit be upon us now and forever. From the bottom of my heart and together with my family, we thank you very much and may God bless us all.






The school supplies will be distributed the week of August 27th.
