He was put to death in the body but made alive in the Spirit. ¹⁹After being made alive, he went and made proclamation to the imprisoned spirits— ²⁰to those who were disobedient long ago when God waited patiently in the days of Noah while the ark was being built.

Dear St. Paul UMC and East Alton 1st UMC,

Grace and love be to all in this Lenten season. A season of reflection and meditation. Although as Christians, these practices must be done on a regular and spiritual manner be it every day, maybe before retiring at night or perhaps like the prophet Daniel did it, 3 times a day... morning, noon, and nighttime. But what matters most is how your hearts are when you go through your personal moments with God. We must always remember; "God sees the heart when it comes to our relationship with HIM." The passage that you have just read above spoke to me personally. I used it on Sunday Feb 18th. Some preachers would center on Christ's suffering, His death and resurrection. They may preach about His sacrifice for the unrighteous. Or make an exegesis (interpretation/explanation) on Noah and the Ark. But I saw only one thing, and for me... that message gave me peace. I learned about the Patience of God on all His creatures. Animals, big and small, birds in the air and creatures of the sea, they are all special to God. But for humans, God has a special place in His heart.

In <u>Hebrews 2:5-8</u> it says: "⁵ It is not to angels that he has subjected the world to come, about which we are speaking. ⁶ But there is a place where someone has testified: "What is **mankind** that you are mindful of them, a son of man that you care for him? ⁷ You made them a little lower than the angels; you crowned them with glory and honor ⁸ and put everything under their feet." In putting everything under them, God left nothing that is not subject to them."

Believe it or not, in spite of all of the things we have done and what we have said against our GOD, he patiently waits for us. He continues to call us and pray for us, hoping that we get right with Him. For 120 years, before the flood came and destroyed the people of disobedience, God, through Noah, spoke and preached about repentance. I believe Noah and His family were laughed at, mocked, and experienced tremendous attacks during those days. But Noah kept his faith and did what needed to be done. Unfortunately, only his family was saved, 8 in all. You know what? I felt the broken heart of God seeing all those people being swallowed by the great waters. But the Lord was ready to show mercy and forgiveness to those who would come back to Him. But... nobody came. Only these few survived.

And so, I pray that we make this Lenten season a time to yield to our Lord's voice by submitting and presenting ourselves wholly and acceptable in his glorious sight. We have many ways to connect with God. We pray, we fast, we serve, we worship, and we are with other believers to sing songs of praise. I mean... we have all the means. But the bottom line... make it a goal to meet our Lord in Christ sincerely and intimately in these coming Holy days. Let us be one with the FATHER, one with the SON, and one with the HOLY SPIRIT. To sing Psalms and Hymns and spiritual songs with thankfulness in your hearts to God (*Colossians 3:16*). Let us not get used to the world's culture of "Eat, Drink, and be Merry for tomorrow you die." I tell you... this is not God's purpose. There is more to life than these things. We need to deepen our purpose by being with the Lord; live a Christ-like life and share the blessings of the Lord with others. Through these means, not only do we please God, but we make our lives more meaningful and significant. The Bible says in *Psalm 147:11* "The LORD takes pleasure in those who fear Him, in those who hope in His mercy." Praise be to God!

And so... I call on you, my brothers and sisters in the Lord, find God's heart in this observation of Lent. In CHRIST JESUS... SEE HIM, LISTEN TO HIM, OBEY HIM, AND LOVE HIM with all your heart. Have a wonderful and purposeful Lent. God bless you until my next letter.




Set your clock ahead one hour!






MONTHLY LOOSE CHANGE PROJECT

Hickerson Scholarship 2024

The tragic skiing accident of January 15, 1995, that claimed the life of Meghan Hickerson of Hartford, IL, will never be forgotten.

God has a way of healing hurt and turning tragedy into triumph. Meghan's death immediately gave life to several people, known collectively as "organ donor recipients." Her legacy of faith and service lives on through the "Meghan Hickerson Christian Teen Leader Memorial Scholarship" that is made available through St. Paul UMC.

Meghan was a student leader who set a standard of excellence within the public school system. She also set an example of faith and dedication by spreading God's love through her church and her academic life, to all she encountered. Our goal each year is to reward one or two

deserving college-bound, graduating seniors who set for him or herself the same standards of outstanding scholastic achievement and faith reflected in their everyday life.

Graduating seniors from the three area high schools (East Alton-Wood River, Roxana, and Civic Memorial) or any who are a member of St. Paul UMC may apply for the **\$500.00** scholarship.

Joe Hanfelder, 82, passed away at 5:22 p.m. on Friday, February 23, 2024, at Alton Memorial Hospital. He was born on November 15, 1941, in South Roxana, the son of the late William Charles & Josephine (Gascho) Hanfelder. He met the former Judy Tuttle at the East Alton Dairy in 1961 and they married in 1963. They built a house from the ground up and lived there until 1976. They then moved to Moro and had ten



acres where they raised chickens, cows, pigs, and rabbits. At one time, he had over five hundred rabbits and every week he took one hundred rabbits to the market.

Survivors include three daughters and two sons in law: Michele & Dennis Johnson of Meadowbrook, Melissa & Richard Hosto of Edwardsville, Manda Jackson of Bethalto, six grandchildren: Dennis Johnson, Jr., Josephine Johnson, Adam Hosto, Allie Hosto, Nathan Rector, Noah Hanfelder, three sisters and a brother in law: Rita Sutton of South Roxana, Gladys Abernathy of East Alton, Phyllis & Dale Noble of Wood River, many nieces, nephews, and other extended family and friends.

Joe graduated from Roxana High School in 1959. He went to work at the East Alton Dairy and then went into business with Henry Hahnenkamp at Melhville Dairy in 1964. He also worked at Wonder Bread and was a 7Up distributor in South St. Louis. In 1978, he started Meadowbrook Dairy Store and later started Joe and Judy's Food and Drink with the aid of his wife. He later went to work for Hilmes Distributing and later founded Riverbend Distributing and worked there until he retired. He was on the ground floor of developing IPSA – Independent Postal System of America. After retiring he worked as a custodian at St. Paul UMC of Rosewood Heights from 2008-2022. He was a member of the United Church of Christ. Joe loved fishing and gardening and he always

had a big garden. He would always take a couple of five-gallon buckets full of

tomatoes to give to folks who didn't have a garden.

In addition to his parents and his wife, Joe was preceded in death by a grandson: William Johnson, four brothers: Kenneth Hanfelder, Arthur Hanfelder, Robert Hanfelder, Charles "Chuck" Hanfelder, five sisters: Helen Perry, Doris Stille, Margaret Hinkle, Alice Schuessler, and Kathryn Smith.

Please, keep Joe's family in your prayers as they journey on without him. Joe was a very amazing man who took good care of us at St. Paul UMC. He is greatly missed by all of us.
