(In case of extreme weather the service is held in the sanctuary!)





MONTHLY LOOSE CHANGE PROJECT

I want to thank everyone for the vital role they have played in the ministry to the children of our church and neighborhood. To all who volunteered, thank you for participating in the powerful gift of God through the

work you have done. The tremendous success of our VBS is thanks to your commitment to provide leadership throughout the week!

To our church family, I want to say how deeply I appreciate the gifts of your time, talents, donations, service, and prayers. These are what make us strong and effective!

We had a great adventure at G-FORCE as our navigators learned how to Explore God's Love In Action. Our interactive Bible lessons revealed five action words that taught us how to follow God's plan for our lives:

MOVE-ACT-CARE-FOLLOW-SHARE.

We began each day with Hi Energy Praise Songs and puppetry. After that, we navigated to several stations as we learned that "In God we Live, Move, and Exist." -Acts 17:28a. Our station activities expanded our lessons as our action packed adventures took us to Crafts, Movie, Outdoor Fun, Nature, Creation Station, Science Discovery, Snacks, and Story. Each station had the purpose to navigate us so we could learn about God's Love In Action.

We were blessed with a combined total of 30 different children, youth, and adults who came together to experience God's Love In Action. Throughout the week we were able to gather 20 food items and \$2.25 to donate to the Community Hope Center. We have always raised money for various projects and charities. Remembering back, our offering once helped buy a garden brick and a garden block that were placed in out Prayer Walkway in the park in memory of Spencer Bacus, who lost his fight way too early to Giant Congenital Nevus in 2018. Spencer was a big part of our VBS family for over 20 years and remains in our hearts at VBS. Our love and prayers continue to be with his family as his light continues to shine through us (#SHINELIKE SPENCER).
