



#### To the People of St. Paul United Methodist Church,

Or... are we more than what we are to them? Let us be more intentional and invest in creative ways to make sure our events have reached the families that live here in our area. Something that will make them feel welcome and not just for United Methodists only.

As I've said, we have a beautiful facility. So let us use this facility to our advantage. We have exerted so much effort in sustaining this big area, now it is time we benefit from what this place can do to the community for the sake of the Gospel. I know we are afraid of any mishaps that may lead to lawsuits that may affect our church insurance. However, this campus ground was not built to stand as a display for the community. It was not built to make the insurance companies richer. This facility is not just for United Methodists. This place was not built to be well maintained until we run out of resources. This facility was built for a purpose and that is to bring more souls to God. So that means this is for all. A place where all people can gather be it your friends, families, or neighbors. Bring them here in this place and let them know who Jesus Christ is. This is the Mission of St. Paul UMC. Let the whole community know that we preach truth and the love of Christ. But we can also be fun, candid, and spontaneous.

And so, in these final months of 2024 we must achieve our goals to bring more people to the Lord's Table because if we don't, this year will never be different from the rest of the years we've had. Are we just here to exist and not to persist? Are we just here to be contained and stay in our comfort zone? Would you think our Lord will be pleased if that is all we are?

Therefore, we must become bolder and courageous. God said to **Joshua**, 3 times, *"Be strong and courageous!"* I believe he did that. God indeed was with Joshua to the end. Thank you to all of our volunteers and helpers. I know that many of you are exhausted already. But there is no time to be tired and weak. We are in a spiritual warfare and giving up is not an option. We stand by the Word of God and His Will must be done to defeat the enemy. I say this with love in my heart and in Jesus' divine name.



# Results of Congregational Input!

Thank you to everyone who stayed for the **Informational Congregational Meeting** in September so as to offer your input on the two questions concerning actions taken at the UMC General Conference. There were 49 people of the congregation who voted and the results on both questions were right about 50/50. This information was then taken to the Church Council Meeting later in September to help them make their decision on the two questions. The Church Council is where the final decision had to come from. After much discussion a private vote among the 10 Church Council members present was taken. The result of the vote was:

- **1.** A policy has been adopted by St. Paul UMC of Rosewood Heights prohibiting any same-sex marriage to be performed on this property.
- 2. The Church Council of St. Paul UMC of Rosewood Heights requests that the IGRC District Superintendent and Bishop not appoint a LGBTQ+ clergy to St. Paul UMC when making pastoral appointments.

Please, remember that this is not a permanent decision and can be revisited after one year if the question arises. We thank everyone for their input and patience as this matter was being decided. -Church Council of St. Paul UMC-

We'll gather for an old-fashioned Methodist hymn sing, be introduced to our 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary commemorative historic sites, hear a message from Illinois Great Rivers Conference United Methodist Church Bishop David Bard, and join in a re-covenanting service as we look forward to the future for Methodists in Illinois.
