To the People of St. Paul United Methodist Church,

Happy happy belated Thanksgiving to everyone! I hope and pray that all of you had a wonderful and meaningful celebration with your loved ones and friends. FYI, in Philippine culture, we do not have Thanksgiving. But they know this American custom because many American citizens who are living in the country continue this wonderful tradition. Since Thanksgiving is about thanking God, reunions, and overflowing food and "get-togethers" we have embraced this special Holiday effortlessly. We love God, we love family, and most of all, our common denominator... FOOD. Let us now get back on track

The time of Advent begins on Sunday which is the first of December. What a coincidence. Advent is about the time of preparation before the birth of Jesus; this tradition was born from our early Christian brothers and sisters in the 4th and 5th Centuries. To give you an idea, here is a brief history of Advent and how it changed over time so all of us will know why we do this every year:

The origins of Advent are not well documented, but the first traces of the season appear in the 4th century. Here are some key events in the history of Advent:

- **4th century:** The church in France used the time before Epiphany to prepare for baptism, which was called "St. Martin's Lent."
- 5th century: The first evidence of Advent worship practices comes from Ravenna, Italy.
- **6th century:** Roman Christians began to associate Advent with the coming of Christ. Pope Gregory I composed many of the prayers, antiphons, and psalm responses.
- 8th century: Advent was generally observed for six weeks in the East and seven in the West.
- 12th century: Advent was shortened to four weeks in the West.
- **1946:** Richard Sellmer, a German printer, printed an Advent calendar and introduced it to the United States with the help of President Dwight D. Eisenhower.

Advent is a season of preparation for Christmas that focuses on Christian life in light of the second coming of Christ. The word "Advent" means "coming" or "arrival."

Technically, we could do away with Advent in my opinion. I love Christmas songs. Regrettably, if we strictly follow the rules, advent will prevent us from singing "Joy to the world the Lord is come" before Dec 25. This issue caused controversies and divided opinions among Christians who are strict in their observance of the Yuletide celebration. But it is what it is. I hope and pray that people will show grace. Instead of being extremely opinionated about this practice, let us focus on why we do it. And that is the arrival of the Messiah. Jesus Christ's birthday needed to be celebrated, and Advent was part of that Celebration. Just think of Advent as our way of preparing for HIS coming. Just like what John the Baptist did. He faithfully prepared the way of the Lord because God chose him to be his messenger. We are God's messengers. And we must be Intentional and Faithful to our call to tell the world that Christ our Savior has/is come. So go ahead, sing Christmas songs or you can wait and observe Advent. Bring out your decorations; say Merry Christmas with conviction and love. You can even wear a Santa costume but just remember, Christmas without Christ is no Christmas at all. It does not make any sense if we say "**Merry Clausmas**," right? I'm sure God would not agree with that concept.

And so, let us begin the countdown. And as we wait, let us be in prayer, let us be hopeful, and let us be loving with one another until... until we arrive on the day Jesus Christ was born.

29th: Scriptures: *1 Samuel 2:18-20, 26; Psalm 148; Colossians 3:12-17; Luke 2:41-52*








EVENING RE-AWAKENING SERVICE → Re-Awakening continues a pause.


