



## OUR CHURCH FAMILY & THANK YOUS!

Children's Church begins at the start of our 8:45a.m. Worship Service. A little bit into the service we have a Children's Moment.


A variety of activities are then held in the Children's Church room after the Children's Moment. For November we will be focused on all things thankful! See you on Sundays!
