



VBS 2025 NEEDS A DIRECTOR! MIGHT THAT BE YOU??



MIDWEST MISSIONS WORK DAY

Almost everyone has heard of the Midwest Mission Distribution Center that the United Methodist Church has and the work that it does. Many have expressed a desire to be able to go to it and to help in the work, but feel that age and/or abilities stop them from doing the work. SO.... Midwest Missions is coming to us.

In January we are having a **rice meal packaging event.** We will complete 600 rice meals. Each pack will feed a family of six. These rice meals are sent to areas of the world that are in great need of food. This event will be held at <u>East Alton First UMC</u> and is a combined effort of St. Paul UMC, East Alton First UMC, and the Wesley House.

Currently we have <u>January 17-18</u> as the planned dates (with <u>February 7-8 as back-up dates</u>). The date for the actual "work" will be <u>Saturday at 11:00a.m.</u> The materials will be brought to the church the Friday before. The work is easy enough to be done while sitting and will take usually less than two hours. The food packets will be prayed for by Pastor Ed on the Sunday after and then taken to MWMDC on the Monday. They will be added to other packets, prayed over by the staff at MWMDC, and then shipped out. Once they are sent we will be notified as to who will be receiving this blessing.

I pray that we will have **more people than needed** for this. 


Wesley Heritage Tour with the Krosts
