This month of May includes the **National Day of Prayer** (*May 1*<sup>st</sup> *2025*) with its theme written by Paul to the Romans chapter 15 verse 13:

"Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Romans 15:13

**HOPE** is a word that this world has been longing for since Humans fell into the trap of sin that led to death. 




