To the People of St. Paul United Methodist Church,

Paul writes in <u>Colossians 4:2-4</u>:

² Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving; ³ praying at the same time for us as well, that God will open up to us a door for the word, so that we may speak forth the mystery of Christ, for which I have also been imprisoned;⁴ that I may make it clear in the way I ought to speak.

Hello everyone and **Happy 249th Birthday America!!** I hope that you are all well and encouraged even though our country has been experiencing numerous disruptions, disorder, and even a taste of a short-lived war between two opposing countries. We thank God because we are at peace and can celebrate the freedom that America has! For the time being ongoing negotiations have been happening...we need more prayers from the faithful in God. The gospel of **Matthew** says in **24:6** where Jesus is speaking: "You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things <u>must</u> happen, but the end is still to come."

So, these past months should not be a surprise, especially to those who are reading God's Word. We are indeed seeing the signs, but we should not allow our emotions to take over because it will just cause more anxieties and troubled hearts. Instead, our passage in Colossians has been reminding us to find refuge and peace in the Lord by praying and worshipping him at all costs. When we all devote ourselves to prayer, with thanksgiving and always staying alert, the Lord will definitely give us comfort and guidance on what to do. So what then should we do? As Paul has said, let us get down on our knees and pray; praise and keep on doing what the Lord has commanded us to do and that is... to preach the love of Jesus to all, make them disciples, and let them see in all of us the joy of a Jesus follower.

On May 27-June 1 we had a successful turnout of our combined **VBS (Vacation Bible School).** This was between East Alton 1st and St Paul United Methodist Churches. More than 40 kids attended the week and at the culmination of the gathering, these kids ministered to the congregation of East Alton 1st and sang songs of praise and about Jesus. Unfortunately, a big protest in LA California happened just days after and other places participated as well. I mean, talk about the work of the enemy; he could not disrupt VBS, so might as well take it out on some other means. And I thank the Lord that not only our kids heard about Jesus, but they also became instant missionaries of Hope and Encouragement. Folks, our devotion is not to worry or be troubled by this depraved world. Our focus is not on our leaders and their political issues and rivalries. Our main concern is Jesus and the teaching and preaching of the gospel and God's redemption and forgiveness for all. Our call to make disciples of others has not changed since Christ commanded His followers with the great commission written in **Matthew 28:16-20**. One thing I have observed is that the world is getting angrier and angrier every day and before you know it, it has escalated into something more destructive. That is a big problem.

Unless the Christian community will do its part of praying with much urgency, giving all our petitions to God, peace will never be achieved. A life of prayerlessness is a dangerous path. Those who do not believe may have an excuse but for believers not to pray leads to uncertainty and vulnerability. We must not allow this to happen. Therefore, my two cents worth for this reading: **Pray unceasingly, pray with hope, find means to be with the Lord in troubled times because HE can give us strength, and praying will draw us closer to God. Never allow the enemy to take hold of your emotions and decision-making. Always have the power of the Holy Spirit in and with you, and be assured then that you will never be alone.**




In a world where you can be anything ... Be Kind!
