To the People of St. Paul United Methodist Church,

Hebrews 4:14-15

14 Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession.

15 For we do not have a high priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but ONE who has been tempted in all things as we are, yet without sin.

The Love and Grace of our Lord be upon you this November. This month is packed with a lot of great memorials and Thanksgivings. Veteran's Day is on Nov. 11th, Thanksgiving is on the last Thursday-the 27th, National Native-American Heritage Month is Nov.; it will include the start of Advent, and the end of Daylight Saving Time. But in November, American Diabetes Month and Epilepsy Awareness Month have also been declared to raise our attention and understanding; for I am sure many lives were cut short due to these illnesses and stress-related causes.

We are grateful to God; that His leading has been a blessing and great encouragement. There are not enough words to describe our gratitude and praise to the God of heaven and earth through Jesus Christ our Savior. Indeed, we have the Great High Priest who was willing to give everything to the point of death, which is His greatest sacrifice and love for the godly, even to the ungodly. So, I'd like to share with you one of my morning devotions to let all of you know how good our God is. From "In Touch Ministries," they wrote, and I quote:

"We often try to comfort others who are going through a difficult time. But on occasion, our attempts to console create even more pain. Well-intentioned words like "You're in my thoughts and prayers" or even "I understand" may feel empty to those who are struggling—unless we have endured something similar. We all long to feel understood, and today's passage reassures us that our Savior truly sympathizes because He experienced struggles like ours.

The writer of Hebrews refers to Jesus as our High Priest. Each year the man serving in this capacity would enter the Holy of Holies and, in God's presence, offer a sacrifice for sin. The priest was the Jewish people's bridge to God. Christ not only took on this role, but He Himself also became the sacrifice when He died on the cross. Now He sits at the right hand of the Father in heaven and intercedes on our behalf (Hebrews 1:2-4; Hebrews 7:25).

That is tremendously encouraging, but even more than that; we know Jesus truly understands our pain and our weakness. He faced the very temptations, needs, and hurts we experience. If you feel alone in the hardships you're facing, recall Jesus' trials and hurts. You'll find comfort knowing that the One who loves you beyond all measure understands exactly how you feel."

Praise be to God in Christ. Have a meaningful November! Happy Veteran's Day and Happy Thanksgiving to all.


We are now starting to collect toward the 2025 Staff Christmas Gifts thru Sunday, December 14th.
