#### To the People of St. Paul United Methodist Church,

**Isaiah 41:10** "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

The peace of the Lord be with you. May you find this short message encouraging and hopeful. We are now in the final stretch of 2025. In these few months we will go through several exciting holidays, days off, and special

events that will bring about more of God's grace and love. Of course, we do not want to pick up speed these last 3 months. That is not the goal. The goal is to continue the work of Jesus Christ with more intention and determination.

But what I was deeply sad and outraged about was that some people were rejoicing and celebrating over Mr. Kirk's death and posting it on social media as if others who had been affected by the incident would be comforted by their outrageous posts. It showed me that here in America, public execution was ok, glorified, and justifiable. Not only that, many of our public forums, e.g., TV networks, social media, and radio programs also joined in the same way. Instead of condemning the act without any doubt whatsoever... many of them were in total agreement. Talking about free speech... I call these acts of violence, downright selfish, heartless, and evil. Well, I am not surprised, looking back from the time of the Apostles and the 1st generation Christians; they were all persecuted and even executed. Many of them died for the sake of the gospel and the truth. Jesus himself was crucified on the cross because many were indoctrinated away from the original purpose of God, which was and is grace, forgiveness, and love. But this is the sad story of this world. So, what do we do?

We must remain faithful and vigilant. We must continue to be praying servants of God. We must remain connected with God in Christ Jesus our Savior. Through the power of God's Holy Spirit, we shall be able to overcome the powers of the principalities and evil of this world. There is no doubt, evil is real. But let us rejoice, because God's truth, justice, and peace throughout the land have already been written in Christ Jesus, the hope of humankind. He is the victory over all God's enemies. And each one of us can participate in the glory of God through the Son. Such a blessing, indeed. God will strengthen and help all who have believed

and put their faith in Christ Jesus. And God will uphold His righteous right hand forever.








# World Communion Sunday, October 5th
