Matthew 1:23 "Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us."

The highlight of the celebration is in our churches, and our church prepares a grandiose musical Christmas Cantata presented either on Christmas Eve or on Christmas Sunday. We have a big choir, so it is an unbelievable sight of the depiction of Christ coming through music and word.

Indeed, the Christmas spirit is very strong not only in the whole country but in the heart of every person. As much as we can, we continue that culture in my family, even if we are 5000 miles away. We do our best to tell the world that Christ, the newborn King, is the center of Christmas. He is the reason for the season. He is Emmanuel, God with us. Born of a virgin. Wrapped in swaddling clothes. And will reign through all generations to come.

And so, I pray that your celebration will be about Jesus Christ. I hope that your families will welcome the Son of God in your gift giving, your meal fellowship, and your family devotions. And I also pray that you will pass on the torch of peace and hope to your children, full of love and understanding. In **Matthew 1:18-23** it says this:

18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. 19 Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly. 20 But while he thought about these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. 21 And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins." 22 So all of this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying: 23 "Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "God with us."


