Colossians 3:17 Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father.

The peace of the Lord be with you all this new month of February. I hope and pray that everyone has been staying warm and safe in this winter season. January 24th, 25th, and 26th was an experience we will not soon forget. Forecasters said, and I quote:

"The severe winter storm dated January 24-25, 2026, was rated as a 'colossal' and a 'historic' event, characterized by the National Weather Service as a widespread 2,000-mile system. It caused 'catastrophic' ice accumulation, widespread power outages for over 800,000 customers, and record-breaking cold, with wind chills as low as -30°F to -40°F in some regions."

Thank God that the USA has the capability to contend with these kinds of weather conditions. As advanced as we are, many lives have been affected. If not for the knowledge of this nation, many more could have lost their lives and their livelihood as well. We are blessed indeed. We are grateful to God for making this country what it is today. And we continue to pray for its strength to remain. A faith that is only given by God. The saying "In God we Trust" is in a constant struggle. Only in God through Christ, can all Christians stand in the truth found in our Lord. That is why Colossians 3:17 made me think deeper. You would agree with me that any form of violence in "words and deeds" is not godly. They are not! Just as "oil and water" cannot mix on its own. They separate when you let them stand. Paul saying... "In words or in deeds" does not mean verbal abuse and aggressive actions are justified as godly. They are not! Peaceful protests are good. Praying in churches, synagogues, and on the streets, and asking God for peace and reconciliation. Calling for a revival and showing the goodness of God are godly acts.

It is so sad that people on both sides of the fence would rather rely on their emotions rather than do what is "righteous" based on the love and sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Come to think of it, Jesus in His final hours... he protested. He protested against the evilness of the heart. He protested against the enemies of His Father God. He protested against sin that will lead to eternal separation from the creator. He protested so righteously... that HE DIED! He endured man's torture, He suffered by being beaten, bruised, mocked, spat at, and crucified on that cruel cross of Calvary. Did he show any violence? Certainly not. Indeed, HE was the lamb that was slain. He even asked the Father to forgive the people because they did not know what they were doing. But what is my point? If you are a follower of Jesus and have faith in HIS all-powerful nature (He did raise from the dead) let Him be our example. For God said, ***"not by might nor by power but by God's Spirit says the Lord."*** (***Zechariah 4:6***). So that means, the Spirit of the Lord, filled with the attribute of God, can be the answer to the growing troubles of the time. Violence and verbal perversion towards others cannot solve anything.

What is the solution? ***2 Chronicles 7:14*** says ***"if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land."*** This is my prayer today and into the future.

While he served our country, Leta proudly did her part by working in clerical services at the U.S. Naval Station in Oakland, California. 





Hickerson Scholarship 2026



The tragic skiing accident of January 15, 1995, that claimed the life of Meghan Hickerson of Hartford, IL, will never be forgotten.

God has a way of healing hurt and turning tragedy into triumph. Meghan's death immediately gave life to several people, known collectively as "organ donor recipients." Her legacy of faith and service lives on through the "Meghan Hickerson Christian Teen Leader Memorial Scholarship" that is made available through St. Paul UMC.

Meghan was a student leader who set a standard of excellence within the public school system. She also set an example of faith and dedication by spreading God's love through her church and her academic life, to all she encountered. Our goal each year is to reward one or two

deserving college-bound, graduating seniors who set for him or herself the same standards of outstanding scholastic achievement and faith reflected in their everyday life.

Graduating seniors from the three area high schools (East Alton-Wood River, Roxana, and Civic Memorial) or any who are a member of St. Paul UMC may apply for the **\$500.00 scholarship**.

We encourage members to notify any student that may qualify and have them complete the application process. Application materials are available through the counselors at the above mentioned schools or directly from the church office.

Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul UMC,

And just like that, we are one month into 2026! We want to thank you all for your generosity in giving of your time, your talents, and your treasures in the past year. Rest assured that the gifts you share with St. Paul UMC are used responsibly and with the greatest care, always looking toward serving Jesus, the community, and the world. What will 2026 bring to us? We never know exactly what will come of a New Year, but we do know that we intend to follow the mission Jesus Christ set forth for us.

The African impala can jump to a height of over 10 feet and cover a distance greater than 30 feet. Yet these magnificent creatures can be kept in an enclosure in any zoo with a 3-foot wall. Why? The impala will not jump if it cannot see where their feet will fall. They will not go where they cannot see. Amazing, isn't it?

Yet in many ways, we Christians are like the impala. Unable to see the future in full detail, we are hesitant to make a financial and personal commitment to the work of Jesus Christ. We are uncertain where our feet will land; we can be paralyzed by this fear.

God calls us to place our faith and trust in Him. For example, in **2 Corinthians 4:18**, Paul tells us we must “fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.” And in **2 Corinthians 5:7**, he reminds us that “we live by faith, not by sight.”

God wants us to leap beyond the walls in our lives, trusting that God will plant our feet upon firm ground. God challenges us to get our eyes off ourselves and focused on Him. Rather than focusing upon what we think we cannot do, let us focus upon what God is able to do through us. For God is able to do more than all we ask or imagine (**Ephesians 3:20**). Your tithing and giving are an act of worship to God. It says volumes about your faith and trust in the Lord. And remember to pray for the ministry you are supporting. We are powerless without the support of your prayers.

We invite you to join your fellow worshipers in making a personal financial commitment with God for the 2026 general budget of St. Paul UMC. Some other physical changes are in the works. Our Worship Ministry Team makes sure that our church building is welcoming each Sunday morning as well as on holidays. The Council on Ministries oversees WOW (Women of Worship), all the Ministry Teams, and Children's Church. We currently don't have a Finance Committee Chairperson so the Finance Committee meets with the Church Council and together they look at our finances every other month. We paid all of our Apportionments in 2025. This is also good stewardship.

As a member of the Church Council I can tell you that we have been aware that St. Paul has had a decline in attendance and in giving. We have been asking, "What can we do to reverse that trend?" One thing we hope will help is having several members attend the See All the People workshop to help us reach out to our members and our community.

I volunteered to write an article about giving for the Steeple because one of our members gave me an idea how to increase my giving and making it pretty painless. Many of us get a COLA (Cost of Living Adjustment) each year from either our pensions or Social Security or both. When I get my first payment with the increase, I figure how much more I'm getting in the current year, and I at least tithe that amount. I don't miss it because I never had it to spend.
